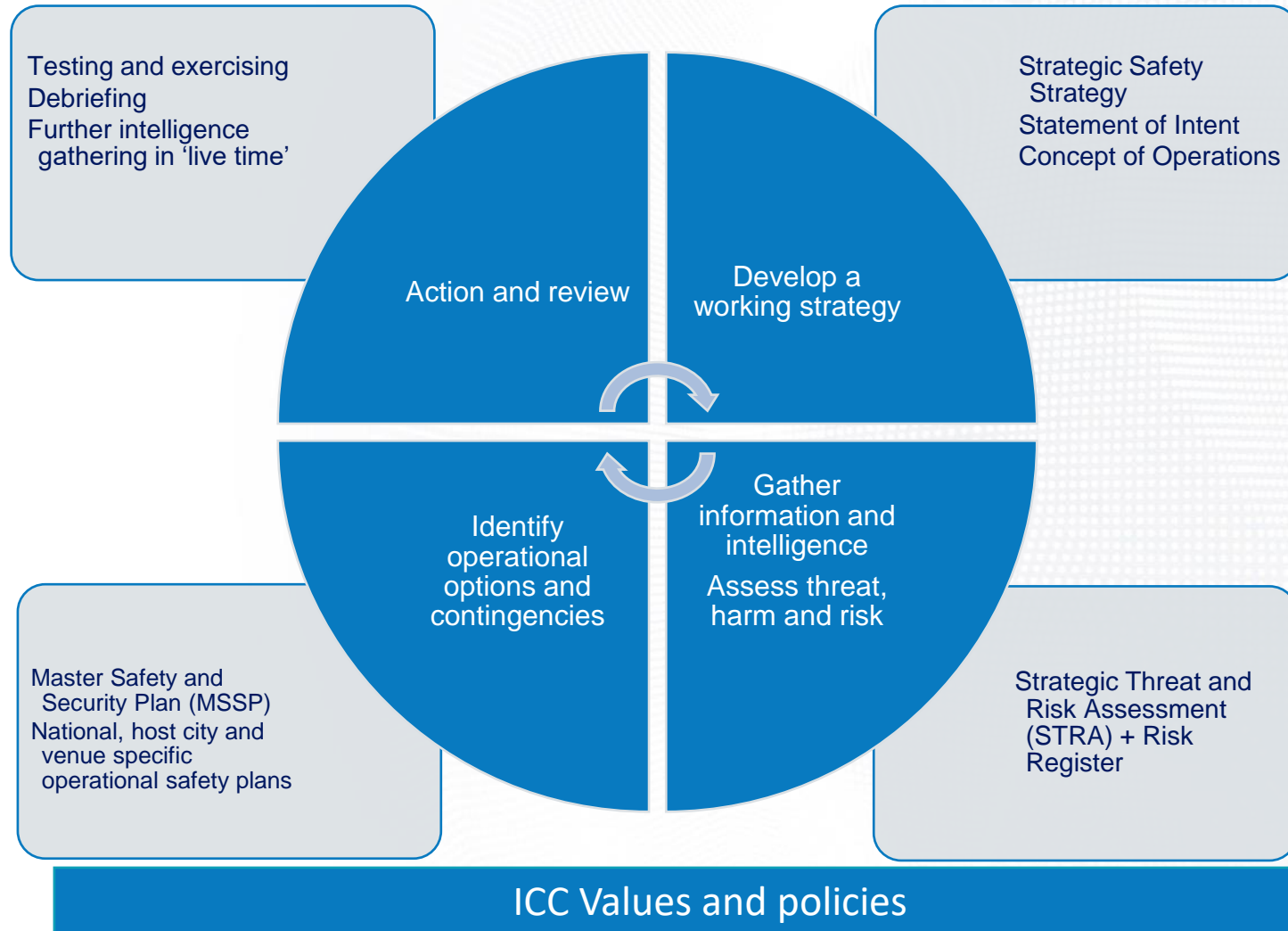
4Ss + CIS

- The ICC Tournament Safety and Security Planning Framework is founded on two high level principles
- **4Ss** - **S**afe, **S**ecure, **S**afeguarded and **S**pectacular events and tournaments
- **C. I. S.** - A planning approach to safety and security operations that is **C**ollaborative, **I**ntelligence led and delivered by appropriate operational **S**tructures

Planning Framework Approach

- **Safety first:** A holistic view of a broader safety and security strategy for participants and attending public – **‘How can we keep people safe?’**
- **Intelligence – led:** Security and safety based on a comprehensive intelligence and risk assessment feeding into proportionate and appropriate planning - **‘What are the safety and security risks and threats associated with the tournament?’**
- **Process driven:** Simple, replicable processes setting minimum standards of safety and security internationally across the ICC Cricket Boards; this approach is relevant to both ICC tournaments and bilateral series - **‘A safety and security plan to mitigate against the identified risks and threats.’**
- **Collaborative:** Collaborative and collegiate nationally, and internationally with the ICC and other partners in planning and operational delivery - **‘Work with partners to deliver the best solutions.’**
- **Responsive:** Iterative process at strategic and tactical levels that is responsive to changes in the national and international security environment and context - **‘A process and a structure for assessing and reacting to changes in the security environment during the lifetime of the tournament.’**

- A holistic view of a broader safety strategy for participants and attending public rather than a narrow focus on security.
- Framework founded on international event management best practice and learning from previous cricketing and sporting tournaments.
- Template for minimum standards of safety and security internationally across the ICC Cricket Boards.
- Collaborative, collegiate approach to safety and security planning and operational delivery.
- Safety and security planning based on a comprehensive intelligence and risk assessment feeding into proportionate and appropriate planning.
- Relevant to both ICC tournaments and bi – lateral series.
- Process is resilient, simple and replicable internationally.
- Iterative process at strategic and tactical levels that is responsive to changes in the national and international security environment and context
