ABOUT THE TOURNAMENT

This is the 13th edition of the ICC U19 Cricket World Cup and the second time that it is being held in South Africa, the first being 22 years ago.

The event will take place between 17 January and 9 February across eight venues in the four cities of Benoni, Bloemfontein, Kimberley and Potchefstroom. The warm-up matches are schedule between 12 and 15 January across six venues in Johannesburg and Pretoria.

The past winners of the tournament are India (four times) Australia (three times), Pakistan (two-time winners), England, South Africa and West Indies, winning it each once.

Automatic qualification was gained by the top 11 Full Members from the 2018 edition – Afghanistan Australia, Bangladesh, England, India, New Zealand, Pakistan, South Africa, Sri Lanka, West Indies and Zimbabwe.

The remaining five positions were filled via a qualification process which began in July 2018 involving 50 teams across eight qualifying events. Five regional qualifiers were confirmed in August 2019, with Japan and Nigeria both qualifying for their first ever ICC World Cup, joined by Canada, Scotland and the UAE.

The 16 teams have been divided in groups of four each with the top two sides from each group due to advance to the Super League. These eight teams will compete for the title of U19 Cricket World Cup champions and the top eight placings.

Teams finishing the group stages in third and fourth place will challenge for the Plate championship. At the culmination of the event, the Plate league will determine the eight teams' placings, nine to 16.



BENONI WILLOWMOORE PARK

City: Benoni

Established nearly a century ago, Willowmoore Park is one of South Africa's most popular venues away from the marquee ones.

It has played host to a number of big matches over the years. In total, Benoni has staged 21 One-Day Internationals (ODIs) and was also scheduled to host its first Twenty20 between the Proteas and Zimbabwe in October 2018, but that was abandoned without a ball being bowled.

The first ODI was played there between Zimbabwe and India on 9 February 1997, with Sachin Tendulkar scoring a century (104) – one of nine at the venue – to help his team to a six-wicket win.

The venue also hosted two matches during the ICC Cricket World Cup 2003, staged by South Africa, and has also welcomed other ICC events like the ICC World Cup Qualifiers in 2009.

Hashim Amla scored his maiden ODI century at Benoni (against Bangladesh), while Dennis Compton's innings of 300 in 181 minutes for MCC against North Eastern Transvaal at the same venue in 1948 remains the world record for the fastest triple ton in first-class cricket in terms of minutes.

The ground remains hugely popular with touring teams, there is also a newly revamped main stand and media centre, with Johannesburg's main city centre less than 45 minutes away.

A relaxed setting with huge grass banks surrounding half the ground, it is a regular favourite for the Proteas Women, who tied with Pakistan there in their last ODI during May 2019.

Another of South Africa's more prominent venues away from the busier centres, the Mangaung Oval was previously an annual stop almost every season for the Proteas.

It staged its first international as early as 1992, when the national team just returned to the global fold, with Andrew Hudson recording a first century in history for SA playing for a Kepler Wessels-led team against India in an ODI.

The Bloemfontein venue has since gone on to host 29 ODIs, while there has also been two T2oIs played there.

More famously, however, it was afforded Test status in 2000 and went on to hold five matches – all won by the Proteas, which makes it the most successful red-ball venue for South Africa's cricketers.

Allan Donald became the first South African to take 300 wickets in Test cricket at this ground against New Zealand in 2000. In the same match Makhaya Ntini claimed his maiden five-wicket haul (6/66).

Another venue with vast grass embankments, it is popular for its relaxed atmosphere, the last of which tasted international action when Zimbabwe visited for an ODI in October 2018.

Situated in one of South Africa's finest sporting grooming grounds, JB Marks Oval is a typical university town attraction that receives some of the best support outside the main cities.

Surrounded by grass embankments, it is a favourite hang-out spot for students, who love to get behind the home team, whether it is the local Lions franchise or when the Proteas come to town.

It has welcomed South Africa twice each in Test matches and T20s, while it has also staged 18 ODIs over the years.

It was a particularly popular destination for the national team during the early years after establishment in 1998, including a visit by Ricky Ponting's Australians, which was famously tied.

Nowadays, it is also a favourite for the Proteas Women, the last international team that played there against Pakistan back in May 2019.

The town itself is a common stop-over for teams and individuals from across all sporting codes wanting to prepare themselves at high altitude, surrounded by top-quality facilities.

The famous university ground is a venue that is not too unfamiliar with international cricket.

It has staged ICC events like the six-team ICC Women's Cricket Challenge, which also featured the Proteas Women.

More recently, there was a Quadrangular Series that made a return to the venue, featuring India, the hosts, Ireland and Zimbabwe.

The ground, along with the Ibbies Oval, has hosted the Varsity Cricket Tournament every year since its inception in 2015.

The Ibbies Oval is the choice facility for overseas teams and has hosted the English bowling squad on numerous occasions.

County teams also favour the venue with the likes of Leicestershire, Yorkshire and Nottinghamshire using the field every year for pre-season preparation.

The name, Ibbies, comes from the second side's name, '1b'. And the 'bies' was added for its unique name.

The Witrand Oval is situated in Potchefstroom and has previously hosted international cricket in the women's game.

Back in 2010, it was one of three venues used for the ICC Women's Cricket Challenge that featured South Africa, West Indies, Pakistan, Ireland, Sri Lanka, Ireland and the Netherlands.

West Indian legend Stafanie Taylor took a particularly liking to the ground by scoring an outstanding 147 there and an 83 against Netherlands and Pakistan respectively.

KIMBERLEY VENUES

The Diamond Oval is one of South Africa's most serene cricket grounds that resonates peace and quiet thanks to its open grassy banks and spectator-friendly layout.

Situated in the Northern Cape, it has hosted 14 ODIs over the years and is always abuzz when the Proteas are in town.

Kimberley is a location famous for the 'Big Hole', a gigantic crater in the middle of the town dug by diamond miners in the late 1800s and early 1900s. This is the main attraction for tourists, but when cricket is on, their 11,000 seater stadium is the hot ticket in town.

It has witnessed eight international ODI centuries, including ones scored by greats like Inzamam-ul-Haq, Chris Gayle, Kane Williamson and Hashim Amla.

One of its highlights was staging three matches during the ICC Cricket World Cup 2003, with one solitary T20I taking place between South Africa and Zimbabwe back in 2010.

The Country Club B field formed part of the De Beers Country Club that was established around the 1970s.

The field was mainly used for club and school league fixtures, with the facilities then donated to Northern Cape Cricket.

It was later upgraded in order to host the local Provincial B Team, Senior Provincial Ladies team and Senior Provincial rural teams.

During the 2003 ICC Cricket World Cup hosted by South Africa, it was used as a practice venue. Most recently CSA hosted the CSA T20 Challenge and four fixtures were hosted at this venue.


