# ABOUT THE TOURNAMENT

**This is the inaugural edition of the ICC U19 Women's T20 World Cup. Some 16 teams are competing in 41 matches across 16 days for the right to call themselves the first ever ICC U19 Women's T20 World Champions.**

The tournament features 11 ICC Full Member teams, which gained automatic qualification, alongside five Associate Members teams from each of the five regions, which qualified through regional qualifiers in their regions. For details, see page 10.

The 16 teams have been divided into four groups:

# PLAYING REGULATIONS

## PLAYING CONDITIONS

## DUCKWORTH-LEWIS-STERN METHOD

The Duckworth-Lewis-Stern (D-L-S) method sets revised targets in rain-interrupted limited-overs matches, taking into consideration the run-scoring resources at the disposal of the two sides. Information on the D-L-S method can be found on [the ICC website](#).

## ANTI-DOPING

The ICC has a zero-tolerance approach to doping and is a signatory to the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) since July 2006. The ICC Anti-Doping Code, compliant with the World Anti-Doping Code, ensures cricket plays its part in the global fight against drugs in sport. ## ANTI-DISCRIMINATION

The ICC has a strict Anti-Discrimination Code that confirms a level of commitment from the ICC and its Members to promote and encourage participation at all levels, regardless of race, religion, culture, colour, descent, national or ethnic origin, and to ensure that there is no discrimination in the sport.

The diverse history and culture of the game draws people together. There is a strong tradition of fans from rival teams enjoying matches alongside each other, while cricket players are also known to mingle with each other and often help each other out with the technicalities of the game. ## ANTI-CORRUPTION

Cricket is considered by many to be a world leader in the fight against corruption in sport and strives to do its best to work towards the vision to "Keep Cricket Clean". All players and officials who take part in the top level of international cricket pass through the Anti-Corruption Unit (ACU)'s education programme.

The ICC's Anti-Corruption Managers coordinate the ACU's prevention measures and are present at tournaments and international series to ensure that strict anti-corruption protocols are enforced at all venues, particularly around the dressing room areas. 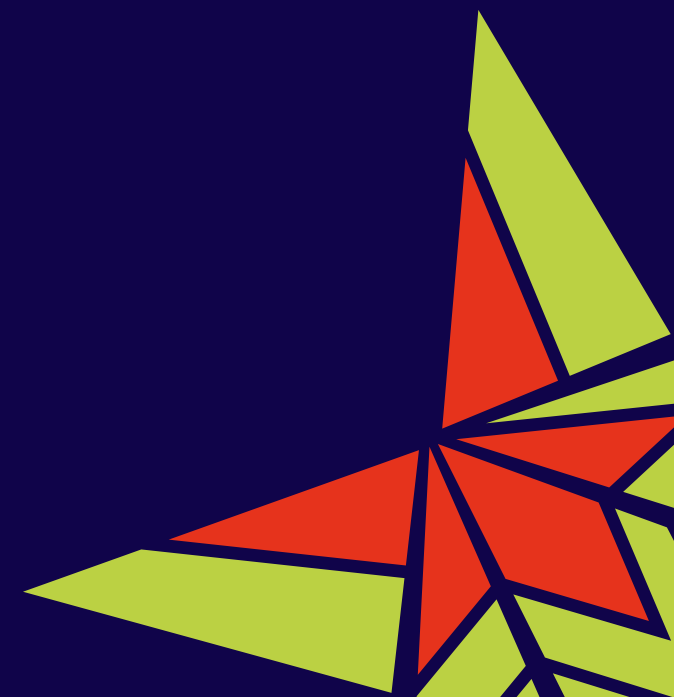

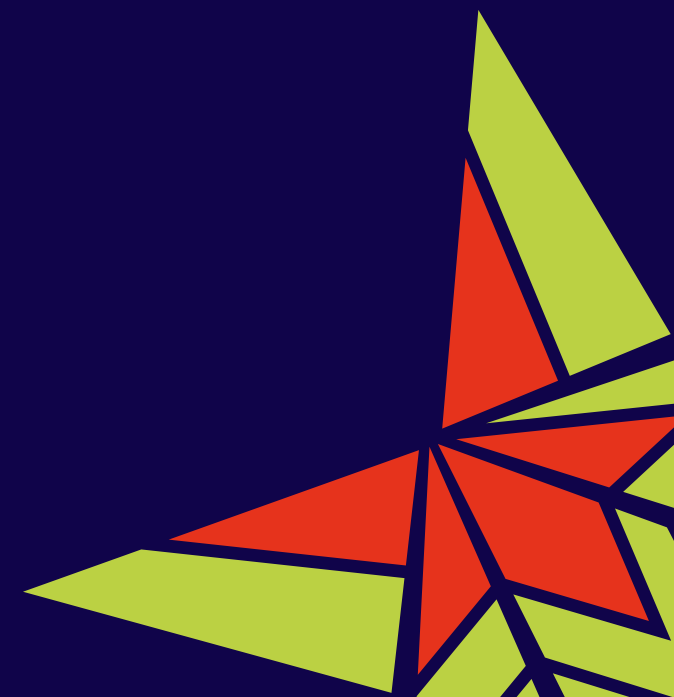

# MEDIA ACCREDITATION



The ICC has accredited media from all over the world for the ICC U19 Women's T20 World Cup 2023. The tournament will be operating under a high trust model, and therefore all accredited media and participants are requested to practice safe behaviour for the duration of the event.

As in previous tournaments, the ICC will follow its priority order in allotting match-day seats. This is done in tandem by the ICC media and accreditation teams, keeping in mind the teams playing. We follow the general principles outlined in the media advisory and FAQs document on accreditation, which we shared at the start of the accreditation process.

Media accreditation passes may be collected from the venues. Reporters will be allotted seats, and a limited number of photographers will be allotted photo positions, keeping in mind the biosafety protocols.

Updates through the tournament will be sent out either individually or to the tournament media email list that we maintain. Please remember to read our

advisories: there may be changes in protocols, biosafety measures, or the way the media interactions are conducted, whether owing to changes in government guidelines or on advice from our own colleagues.

## WHAT IF MY ACCREDITATION IS LOST?

If your tournament accreditation pass is lost or stolen, please report it to the accreditation team and make a formal complaint at the nearest police station. Upon completion of the lost/stolen declaration form, the tournament accreditation will be replaced providing the individual has appropriate ID. If the original tournament accreditation is found, it should be surrendered, and the police should be informed.

Please note that no additional temporary or match day passes will be provided.

# CODE OF CONDUCT FOR MEDIA



Please note that all accredited Non-Rights Holders (NRH) media must adhere to the code of conduct for the tournament as well as the tournament media terms and conditions agreed to while signing the accreditation form.

Accreditation cards of journalists will be cancelled if they are found to behave in an inappropriate manner at any of the venues.

The ICC has a zero-tolerance policy towards racism and sexual harassment, and action will be taken immediately in any such case, which could include suspension of the accreditation card and blacklisting from all ICC events.

Journalists could also face suspension from future matches or have their accreditation revoked if they are found to be in violation of other terms and conditions including those of video and audio recordings at venues.

## NO SHOWS

Journalists who have changed their plans – those withdrawing from the tournament, those who become unavailable to attend particular matches, and/or those who need to change their selection of matches – must please send details in an e-mail to [media-accreditation@icc-cricket.com](mailto:media-accreditation@icc-cricket.com).

**Failure to do so could affect their chances of attending future ICC events. Journalists not informing us of their inability to attend any match of this tournament may not be given a match ticket for subsequent games.**





# SECURITY

**Cricket South Africa (CSA) has developed a comprehensive Master Security Plan for the event, a copy of which has been provided to each participating Member.**

The aims of the Master Security Plan are:

- To deliver a safe and secure tournament for the attending public, media, workforce, teams and officials.
- To provide a proportionate approach to threat and risk that does not detract from the enjoyment of the tournament for those attending and participating.
- To maintain South Africa's excellent reputation for delivering safe and secure international events.
- To minimise the likelihood of a critical or major incident occurring at any tournament venue and to ensure that all contingency plans for such incidents are fit for purpose.

This will be achieved by:

- Maintaining a thorough, structured, intelligence-based approach to threat, risk and harm.
- Working with key stakeholders, venues and law enforcement agencies to ensure a consistent approach and a shared situational awareness.
- Ensuring that a robust command, communication and co-ordination strategy underpins decision-making processes.
- Ensuring that planning principles adhere to South Africa's best practise and legislative requirements.
- Ensuring that regular scrutiny, independent testing and exercises, and workforce upskilling take place.



# BIOSAFETY

This is a summary of the *ICC U19 Women's T20 World Cup 2023 Biosafety Plan*. For full details on the biosafety arrangements for this event, please refer to the detailed biosafety plan.

## COVID-19 VACCINATIONS

There is no COVID-19 vaccine requirement for entry into South Africa. However, in the best interest of the health and safety of those around you, the *ICC* recommends that members of the media are fully vaccinated (double dose) with a booster shot or recovery from infection in the last six months.

## COVID-19 TESTING

There will be no COVID-19 testing carried out by the *ICC* on arrival or during the event. It is recommended that members of the media test before travel to ensure they are free of COVID-19 before travel, and that they arrive at the event free of any infection.

## SYMPTOMATIC TESTING

The *ICC* recommends that members of the media report any symptoms to the *ICC* Media Manager. It is in their best interests to PCR-test any member of the media should they display COVID-type symptoms during the event to avoid further spread of COVID-19 within the team. South Africa has many testing facilities, and the Event Chief Medical Officer can help facilitate a test.

## ISOLATION PERIOD

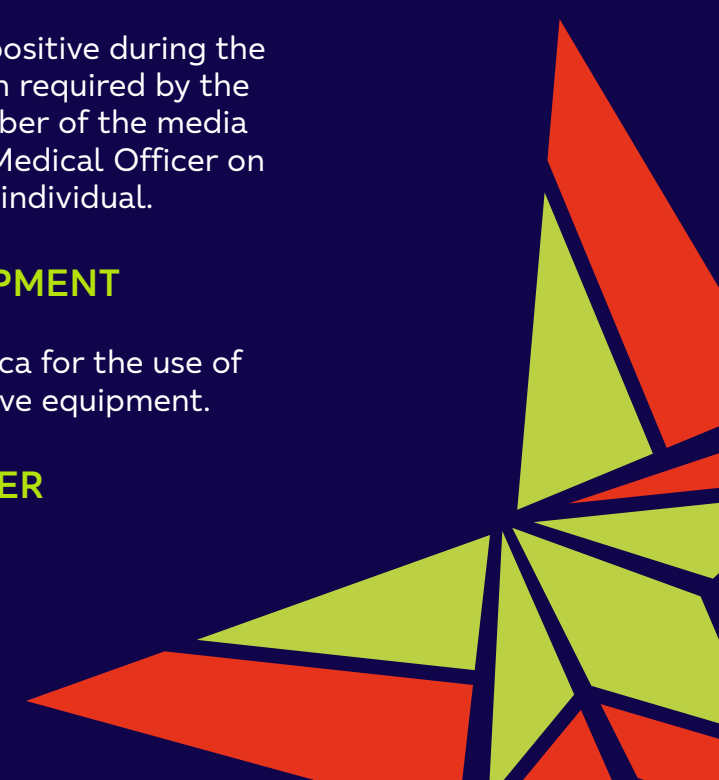
Should a member of the media test positive during the event, there is no mandatory isolation required by the South African Government. The member of the media should consult with the Event Chief Medical Officer on the best way to manage the infected individual.

## PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

There is no requirement in South Africa for the use of masks or any other personal protective equipment.

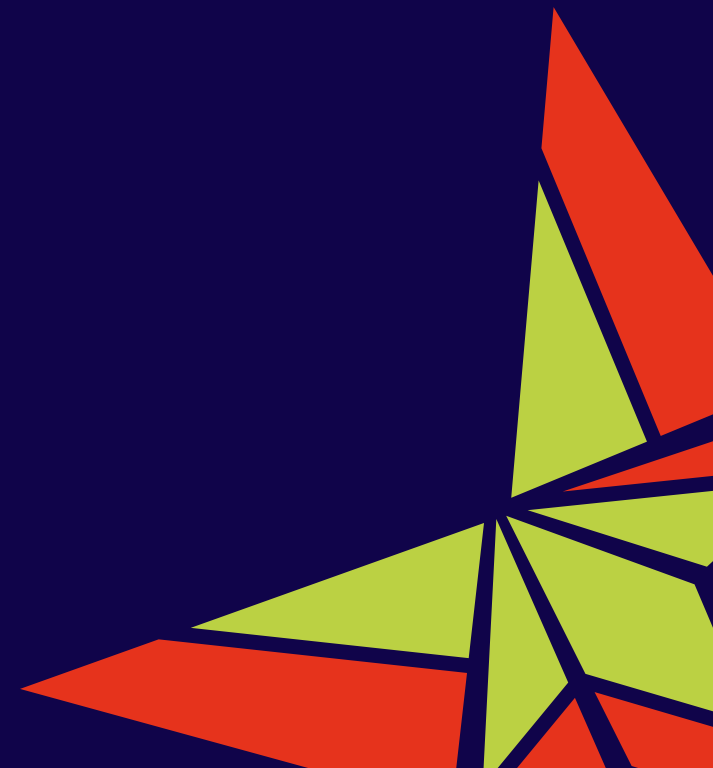

**ICC U19 WOMEN'S T20 WORLD CUP 2023**

The JB Marks Oval hosted the first of its two Test matches in 2002, an innings victory for the Proteas against Bangladesh. The Tigers returned 15 years later for the second Test on the ground, but the hosts again came out on top.

The stadium hosted three group-stage matches at the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup 2003, the first ICC Cricket World Cup to be held in Africa, when it served as the home base for tournament winners Australia. Then during the FIFA Men's World Cup 2010, the first FIFA World Cup held in Africa, it hosted Spain – who also went on to be crowned champions.

The venue hosted a total of nine matches at the ICC U19 Men's Cricket World Cup 2020 – including the final, when Bangladesh defeated India.

### ABOUT THE CITY

Potchefstroom – or 'Potch', to those who know it – is situated along the Mooirivier ('Beautiful River'), less than two hours from Johannesburg. As well as hosting the Potchefstroom Campus of the North-West University, Potch has a strong farming economy and a generous hospitality sector, giving the town a different atmosphere to fast-paced Johannesburg.

Visitor attractions include the OPM Prozesky Bird Sanctuary, home to 200 different bird species; the Buffelsvlei Wild Animal Park; and the monthly art market in the City Council gardens.

Willowmoore Park is named for the willow trees and the moor at the southern end of the ground. Founded by coalminers, the stadium officially opened in 1924 – but the first international match was played 11 years earlier, when a South African invitational team took on England.

Willowmoore Park hosted its first ODI in 1997, a six-wicket win for India over Zimbabwe. It hosted two matches during the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup 2003, along with several other ICC events – including the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup Qualifier in 2009; and two editions of the ICC U19 Men's Cricket World Cup, in 1998 and 2020.

In 1948, Denis Compton famously scored 300 here in just 181 minutes against a South African XI – still the fastest triple ton in first-class cricket history.

## ABOUT THE CITY

Benoni is situated in the province of Gauteng, around half-an-hour east of central Johannesburg. The city contains numerous attractive and tree-lined streets, and has a strong suburban character.

Charlize Theron, the Oscar-winning actress, is among those to have been born here. The city was also the setting for the MTV-inspired cult movie *Crazy Monkey: Straight Outta Benoni*, released in 2005. Key attractions include the local museum, many handsome lakes, and two major shopping hubs: the Lakeside Shopping Mall and Northmead Mall.
